

From the First Enquiry to Registration

Where do I start?

When you're looking for somewhere to further your studies, it's easy to lose sight of what you really want to achieve. So, it is important before you begin inquiring to ask yourself the following questions:

- What do I want from education? What career am I hoping to get into?
- What skills do I want to gain?
- Do I want to live on or off campus?
- What can I afford to do?

Then, write out a list of questions you want to ask, such as:

- What sort of room would I get if I stayed on campus?
- What are my employment opportunities if I graduate with this degree?
- Are there any scholarships available to me?
- What financial help am I eligible for?

How do I Apply?

Once your application is filled in, hand it in, submit it online or post it back to Avondale for processing and you will soon after get a letter advising you that it has been received. Once you receive a letter of offer, you are ready to register!

Registration

Registration occurs the day before classes begin. On this day, you will receive an information pack either from your dormitory receptionist if you are living in the Residence Halls, or from Student Services (in College Hall) if you have chosen to live off campus. In it you will find a list of things you will need to do to make your registration as successful as possible. This includes:

- Financial Clearance;
- Registering for units of study (subjects);
- Acquire a dorm key and room agreement if you are living in the Residence Halls.

The pack will detail the places where you can do the above. New students are given a tour to assist in this process.
