And if an address isn't correct, or is missing parts, how can anyone be expected to understand it, or find it?

Reference List vs. Footnotes ???

Reference List

- Comes at the very end of your document
- Reference lists are arranged <u>alphabetically</u>
- Author's name is in the format <u>last</u> <u>name, first name</u>
- Use <u>full stops</u> to separate fields
- Only include page numbers if they indicate the pages of a complete article or chapter

Footnotes

- Footnotes are added to each page
- Footnotes appear in the order they are found within your document
- Author's name is in the format <u>first</u>
 <u>name last name</u>
- Use commas to separate fields
- Always include specific page numbers for location of information

AUTHOR

- Last name, first initial or first name (whatever Potter, Harry they provide)
- If the author has a middle initial, include it
- If you are separating two authors use 'and'
- If the author is a company (corporate author)
- If there is no author, the title moves into the 'author field.' Do not use 'anonymous' unless the book uses that.

- Potter, Harry I.
- Potter, Harry I., and H. Granger.
- Department of Education.
- German Army.

- For items published in USA: city, state code
- For items published everywhere else: city, country
- It is not necessary to include the state or country for well-known locations
- If you don't know where a place is...Google is your friend!

- Washington, DC.

PUBLISHER

- Cooranbong Publishing Co. Do NOT add the words Publishing, Company, Org, Inc. etc. after a publisher's name. The only words you should ever add are either Press or Books.
- A publishing company is a proper noun...use capital letters.

- The date comes last.
- A comma comes before the date
- A full stop comes after the date.

- Journal article is to be in inverted commas. It
 "Red does not need to be in italics.
 Ref
- A journal title a proper noun, so it needs to be capitalised.
- The journal title also needs to be in italics.

VOLUME, ISSUE, PAGE NUMBERS

- Volume is in italics
- Issue is stated like this:
- Page numbers are listed from the first page to
 13-15. the last

URL

- Needed for electronic journal articles
- Include the word <u>Accessed</u> and the date you viewed the document before the URL e.g. Accessed March 12, 2018.
- If you are given a DOI number, use it instead of a URL.

Miscellaneous FAQs

- If two consecutive references are from the same source, use the term "Ibid" for the second one.
- You ALWAYS need to include page numbers in your footnotes.
- The Bible <u>does not</u> need to be cited in your references; be sure to include the version you used in the first footnote.
