

How to use MedPix




When you click on the website link from the Avondale library page, you will be taken to a page that has a 'Case of the Week' image alongside an overview of the website.

In the top right hand corner, click on the 'CME' menu. The options are 'Current COW' (Case of the Week), and 'Choose a Case.'




CASE OF THE WEEK

If you choose the COW, you will reach a screen with four tabs (Caption, Case, Topic, Quiz) and a 'Quiz On/Off' button. Turn the quiz button to 'Off' if you want to be able to read the case information.



The Case of the Week images are displayed along the top of the screen, with an enlarged version of the selected image displayed on the left of the screen.



How to use MedPix

The 'Caption' tab seems to present some sort of a 'summary'; the 'Case' tab discusses the case in more detail, and the 'Topic' tab provides extensive discussion of the disease/condition, unfortunately without utilising paragraphs.


Towards the bottom of the 'Topic' page is a button to look at further images on the same topic.



If you press on this button, the 'Case images' at the top of the screen will be replaced by 'Topic images', which can then be scrolled through. As you look at each topic image, the information for that case appears on the right hand side of the page.

CHOOSE A CASE

If you select 'Choose a Case' from the CME menu, a screen will open and populate with roughly 120 images. Double click on an image to view brief details of the case and the additional case images. To read the case in more detail, select either 'Show Answer' (opens the case with the 'quiz' turned on) or 'View as Unknown' (opens the case with the 'quiz' turned off.) The screen then opens and operates as described in the 'Case of the Week' above.



SEARCH FOR A TOPIC

What if you want to search for a particular topic, like lung cancer? This functionality currently doesn't exist on MedPix, but will be introduced during 2016.
