

Calculating your tuition fees can be confusing, but we are here to help.

Fee calculations are based on your residency status and fee type, government funding arrangements, and the course of study you choose.



Residency Status and Fee Type

- 1 Domestic Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP)
- 2 Domestic Full Paying
- 3 International

A domestic student is an Australian citizen or permanent resident, a New Zealand citizen or, someone who holds a humanitarian visa. All other students are international students.



Government Funding (or CSP)

A CSP means that the Australian government partially subsidises course fees for domestic students, and you pay a student contribution. Domestic students enrolled in the Master of Teaching (Primary/Secondary) courses at Avondale can receive a CSP.



Course of Study

Most domestic postgraduate students pay full tuition fees, except eligible Master of Teaching (Primary/Secondary) students.

Domestic postgraduate students: A\$2,385* per unit. Full fee-paying students need to pay their tuition fees to Avondale in full. Eligible students can apply to defer their tuition fees to a FEE-HELP loan. Visit www.studyassist.gov.au/help-loans/fee-help to find out more.

HECS-HELP upfront discount: If you are eligible for HECS-HELP assistance, and you pay at least \$500 per unit of study as your student contribution, you will receive a discount of 10 per cent on the up-front payment you make. Visit www.studyassist.gov.au/help-loans/hecs-help to find out more.

Master of Teaching (Primary/Secondary) domestic students: A\$498* student contribution per unit paid to Avondale. Eligible students can opt to defer this amount to a HECS-HELP loan, which can be paid through the taxation system later. Visit www.studyassist.gov.au/help-loans/hecs-help to find out more.

International students: A\$3,257* per unit. International students need to pay their tuition fees prior to classes commencing each teaching period.

*This is the fee for a standard unit of study. Some units attract higher fees. For fees for specific units, please visit www.avondale.edu.au/fees
