



CAMPUS ORIENTATION

THE AVONDALE EXPERIENCE

The Avondale Experience is like no other. From staying in dormitories, to spiritual events on a weekly basis, to sports, to socials, to a supportive network that is truly amazing. This will provide Catalyst participants the opportunity to be part of the overall Avondale Experience.

Catalyst participants will love their mini–Avondale University experience. All Catalyst participants will get to experience a special Festival of Faith week, Friday night SALT vesper programs, Sabbath church services at Avondale University Church, and special gospel concerts and Avondale conservatorium events.

Socials are regularly organised for dorm residents including musical variety nights, sports, games nights, movie nights. Living with Avondale University students from across Australia, New Zealand, and the Pacific will be the Catalyst highlight with many opportunities to make new friends.



Avondale has the following facilities on campus: swimming pool, gym, library, indoor basketball courts, squash courts, outdoor tennis courts, cricket, and football ovals, running and walking tracks, bird watching walks. Avondale University is surrounded by a 300-acre working farm with goats, cattle and vegetable gardens.

There are student facilities such as table tennis, billiard tables, common rooms, student lounges, postal services, stationary shop. There is campus Wi-Fi and a technology support desk for all students and guests.

What to bring

- If you play an instrument (guitar, strings, wind etc.), bring it to join in the musical scene.
- Bedding for dorm room—pillow, doona, sheet set (mattress supplied)
- Towels (shower and beach towels)
- Warm outdoor clothes for camping like warm jacket, merino layers etc.
- Church clothes—winter and summer
- Summer clothes
- Winter clothes
- Swimmers
- Toiletries
- Medication (Chemist and General Practice (doctors) within 700 metres walk)

NOTE: Catalyst participants will have access to local Op Shops from Week 4 onwards to purchase additional clothing that may be required.

Catalyst participants may want to join one of the many student sporting competitions. There are competitions in Basketball, Soccer, Laser Tag, football etc. All the competitions last for the semester and cost \$120 per competition. These costs are personal preference and not included in the Catalyst fees. Avondale is sending a team to Uni Games and there is a major Adventist Schools Basketball competition happening in the mid semester break with Adventist Schools and groups attending from across Australia.



WHERE WILL CATALYST PARTICIPANTS BE STAYING?

Shared twin rooms provide the lowest cost accommodation for Catalyst participants. These shared rooms with access to shared bathrooms will be in Andre Hall for the women, and Watson Hall for the men.

There are single room and twin-share rooms available in both the men's and women's residences:

- Single Room: weekly rent is \$200.20 so the refundable room bond is \$800.80.
- Twin-share: weekly rent is \$140.00 so the refundable room bond is \$560.

Please indicate to Catalyst coordinator or to the Avondale Accommodation coordinator what accommodation type you prefer. It's important to understand that the refundable room bond that you will pay reflects your accommodation preference.

NOTE: if the Avondale University residences are at full capacity, Catalyst participants will only be given twin share accommodation options.

- Apply for a room for 1st Semester 2024 with a move in date of Sunday 25th February to Sunday 12th May. Select "other" as the "student type" and type in the name of the other program as "Catalyst".
- 3. Wait to be allocated a room by the portal.
- 4. Once you receive confirmation of an allocated room, pay a room deposit of 4 weeks room rent.
- 5. When you arrive at Avondale University and check in, you will be supplied with an electronic room access card that is also your Catalyst participant ID card. This card will be used to open your room door as well as record your meals eaten and access to the library services.

WHERE THE CLASS WILL MEET?

All classes will be held in the Catalyst classroom (situated in what was the Nursing Building at Avondale University). This renovated and refurbished classroom will provide a space for interactive and dynamic learning.

PARTICIPANT ID CARD

All participants require a Student Identification Card (ID card). ID cards are used for identification, building access, photocopying and printing, accommodation and parking (if applicable), and transactions such as borrowing books from Avondale libraries. Your ID card is current for the duration of your time as a Catalyst participant.

(NOTE: If you already have an ID card, you may not require a new card. Email Reception to confirm before applying for a new card — reception@avondale.edu.au.)

All Catalyst participants are eligible for a student ID card. Please check that all of your personal details are correct prior to your card being issued. There is a \$20 fee to replace lost or damaged cards. For further information regarding ID cards please see the Avondale website.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Avondale University's Student General Conduct and Discipline Policy encourages and supports active and positive participation in the life of the institution. Avondale expects positive interaction for the Avondale student community in social justice, principles of freedom, respect, equity and consideration.

PARTICIPANT CONDUCT

Just as Avondale University has a responsibility to meet expectations of participants, legislation, and regulations, so too, do participants have obligations they are expected to meet. It is expected that participants will take part with commitment in their studies, regularly submit assessment items, and behave in a manner that does not contravene workplace health and safety or the principle of respect for others.

Avondale University views participant misconduct seriously. We expect that participants will behave in an honest, respectful manner appropriate for a learning environment, and in a way that will uphold the integrity of Avondale. Consequences of participant misconduct vary up to and including expulsion from the course. Examples of participant misconduct include, but are not limited to:

- Harassment, bullying and/or discrimination
- Falsifying information
- · Any behaviour or act that is against the law
- Any behaviour that endangers the health, safety and wellbeing of others
- Intentionally damaging equipment and/or materials belonging to Avondale University and/or a partner organisation such as a school or workplace

Consequences for misconduct will depend on the severity and frequency of the breach and include, but are not limited to:

- Formal reprimand (warning)
- Participant to reimburse the costs incurred by any damage caused
- Matter referred to the police

Participants found guilty of misconduct have a right to

lodge an appeal by following our Appeals Procedure (Academic) or the Student General Conduct and Discipline policy.

Your wellbeing is important to Avondale as you study with us. Avondale has a number of support options available to all participants.

Access and Equity

Catalyst participants have access to meals from 7@ Avondale at student prices. Catalyst participants need to pre-load their ID cards with meal credit prior to attending 7@Avondale for meals.

Catalyst participants will need to agree to a meal contract with 7@Avondale on the Avondale ResLife portal and load credit on their cards. We recommend that Catalyst participants choose the minimum contract of \$119 per week for the duration of Catalyst.

HEALTH/MEDICAL CONDITIONS

All Catalyst participants staying in the Avondale University dormitories will be required to declare medical conditions as part of the application for accommodation.
